CHANGE IN WATER USAGE RATE

The Village has changed the minimum gallons of water usage to 4,000 gallons the rate will remain at \$68.90 for water and the Capital Fee of \$81.00 This change is due to the raising cost of maintaining and supplying quality water to our residents.



ARE YOU AWARE OF SOME OF OUR LAWS

NOISE: Loud, unnecessary, or unusual noise that annoys, disturbs, injures, or endangers the comfort, health, peace, or safety of others within the Village limits **AT ANY TIME** is prohibited. This includes the loud and unnecessary noises that are the result of motor vehicles including motorcycles and other recreation vehicles.

DOG LEASH LAW. Dogs are not permitted to run at large in the Village. All dogs must be confined to their own property unless on a leash. Please do not let your dogs run unleashed at the Village Parks

PLEASE PICK UP AFTER YOUR DOG IF YOU TAKE HIM FOR A WALK

OPEN BURNING Prohibited State-Wide! Small campfires are allowed.

NEVER LEAVE A BURNING FIRE UNATTENDED

BUILDING PERMITS Building permits are required in the Village. Please check with the Building Code Officer, Toby Hammond 716 664-1676 **BEFORE** you start your project.

CURFEW: All individuals under the age of 18, unless accompanied by a parent or guardian, **MUST** be off the Village Streets from 9:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m.
